Good morning! We are happy to report that there are still no signs of symptoms of COVID 19 in our communities! As a result of the decline in cases in Vermont, the Governor is continuing to lessen restrictions on social gathering and outdoor activities. In his press conference on Wednesday, he was very clear that this does not apply to the elderly or those who are health compromised. As a result, we are continuing to operate with the same restrictions. Our residents are very eager to get outside and enjoy the fresh air, so we are trying to accommodate this for their emotional and physical wellbeing while practicing all advised safety measures, including washing hands before and after, wearing a mask and practicing physical distancing of 6 feet.

They are also very eager to see all of you, but unfortunately our guidance from the Department of Health and Department of Aging and Independent Living remains the same and we are not able to permit visitors at this time.
